1. Announcements And Committee Matters

- August and September meeting minutes accepted
- Adam Varat from Planning presented a project management update
 - Request for members to say what they'd like to hear at upcoming CAC meetings
 - Will have Peter Albert of MTA and David Alumbaugh of Planning discuss existing city street design processes and institutional structure at the November 2007 CAC meeting
 - o John Hirten has resigned his seat on the CAC.
- Committee members had the following comments:
 - o Should discuss institutional processes over physical design elements.
 - Describe case study of how go through existing street design process, where are the difficulties, how could processes be streamlined.
 - Describe impact of CEQA on Better Streets Plan. Can have a presentation from the City Attorney's Office?
 - o Should look outside of current laws. Think about what policies could be changed by legislative action.
 - o Discuss policies and outreach.
- Cristina Olea from MTA described the scope of topics for pedestrian policies
 - Request for committee members to say which are their priorities to discuss at upcoming CAC meetings.

- Committee members had the following comments:
 - o Present enforcement of traffic laws.
 - o Coordinate with TEP to discuss how to avoid pedestrian/bus collisions
 - o Discuss construction impacts and safety during construction
 - o Discuss process for getting sidewalk encroachments
 - o Discuss definition of a sidewalk
 - o Discuss no right on reds; pedestrian head starts
 - o Discuss signal timing; bulb-out design (too weak currently)
 - o Discuss timing of commercial of loading zones.

2. DRAFT Urban Forest Guidelines/Street Lighting Guidelines

- Adam Varat of Planning introduced Greg Pasquali of Community Design and Architecture and Joe McBride
- Joe McBride presented Draft recommendations for urban forest guidelines
- Greg Pasquali presented Draft recommendations for street lighting, and how street lighting and street trees interact in the streetscape.
- Committee members had the following comments:
 - Will the plan address watering and pruning? *Yes.* Need to think about plantings with low irrigation needs.
 - o Discuss performance potential of urban forest (e.g. air quality, water quality, carbon sequestration)
 - o Discuss root structures and accessibility; concrete sidewalk upheavals
 - o Consider edible, fruit-bearing trees, and native plantings. *Many native trees have low survivability in San Francisco*. *Native plantings are often more hardy*.
 - o With pedestrian lighting, consider personal safety and security.
 - Work with other departments to work on where trees can and can't be planted.
 - o Discuss decomposed granite as tree basin covering material
